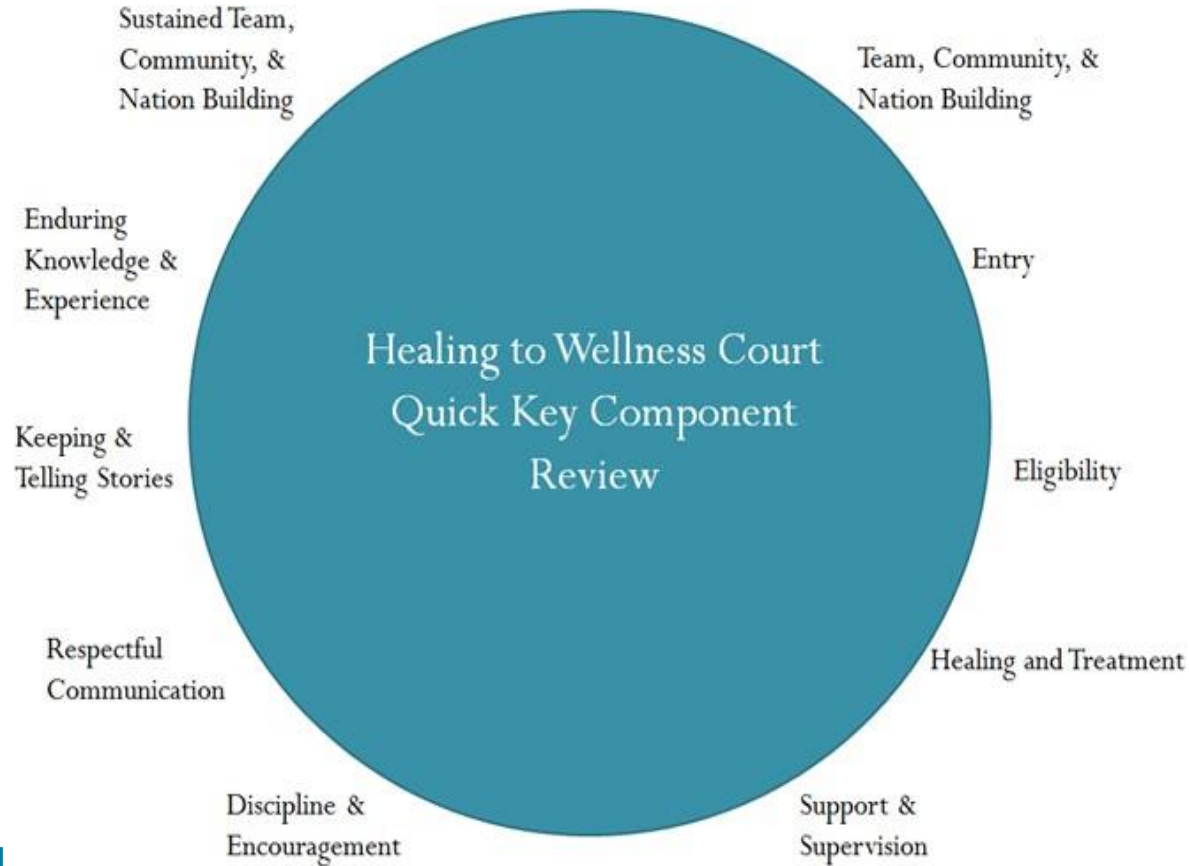
Vision:

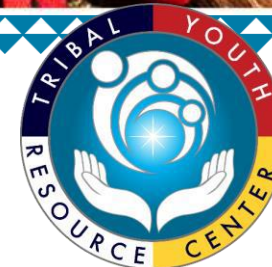

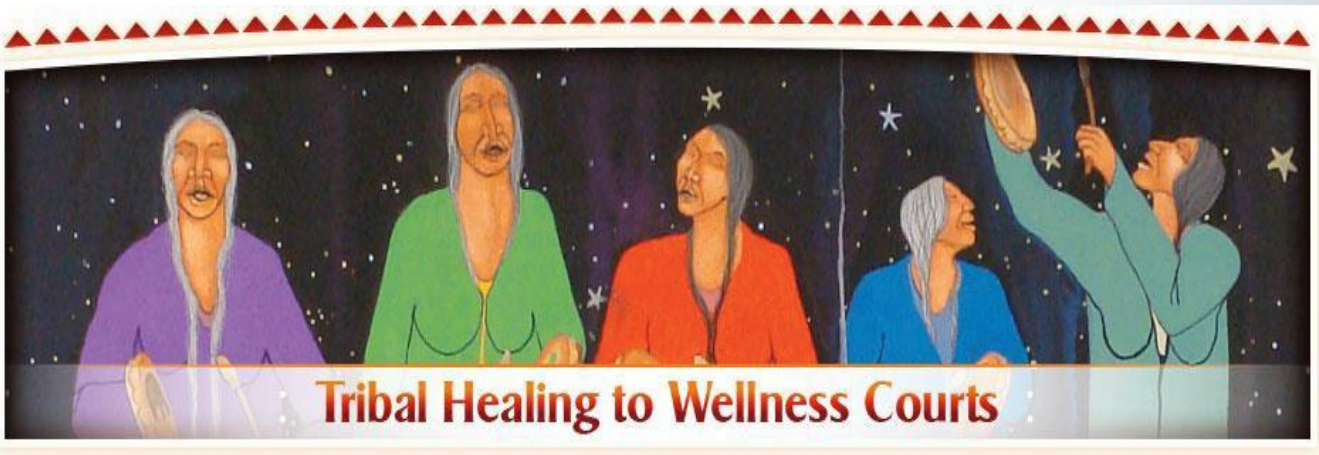
JUVENILE HEALING TO WELLNESS COMMUNITY OUTREACH



► Strategies: (California PL 280 State)

- Get involved within your community, attend their events, and encourage the family members to attend and work together for the benefit of their families and community.
- Help bring awareness to the community.
- Get involved within the city through events [and] town hall meetings, including surrounding communities and counties.
- Reach out to all trainings in your area or online to get the education and qualifications that you will need for your program.
